


This week: Houses on Long Island's East End



1 ◀ East Hampton This 1680s home underwent a complete remodeling and expansion in 2015. The house features exposed beams, a great room with floor-to-ceiling windows, and five en-suite bedrooms. 2 ◀ Mattituck Built in 1990, this four-bedroom house sits on 4 acres along Long Island Sound. Details include an oak-paneled study, an entry hall with sea views, and a screened dining porch. 3 ▶ Sag Harbor

Originally built in 1935, this three-bedroom house was completely reconstructed in 2015. The interior includes a first-floor en-suite master bedroom, hardwood floors, and a sunroom that opens onto a dining terrace. 4 ▶ Amagansett Just 200 feet separate this two-bedroom modern beach cabin from the ocean. Designed by Bates Masi, the house has a fireplace, central air, high-end appliances, and an integrated sound system. 5 ◀ Quogue Nicknamed Little Lincoln Center based on its façade, this five-bedroom house was built in 1950. The home has a music room, an elevator, and a great room with barrel ceilings and direct ocean views. The 0.9-acre property includes a pool, 100 feet of beachfront, and a covered sun deck nestled in the dunes. \$4,800,000. 6 ▼ Montauk This six-bedroom home lies on a cliff overlooking Fort Pond Bay. Features include a chef's kitchen, an upper-level mahogany deck, and a master suite with a large bathroom and private outdoor access. Downstairs, a wall of French doors opens onto a large patio with an infinity pool.

7 ▲ Riverhead Built in 1935, this American Foursquare house has three bedrooms. The refurbished residence retains many original details, including hardwood floors, leaded glass windows, a mantel with built-in shelves, and subway bathroom tiles. Updated amenities include the heating system, a hot tub, and a wooden fence that surrounds the downtown property. \$359,000.
